Applications will only be accepted through the online application platform. Each applicant may only compete at one site.

The first scheduled day of the qualifying competition will be the official practice round, followed by four (4) rounds of the qualifying competition. Play may be extended beyond the final scheduled day (i.e., beyond Friday).

Eligibility

Professionals or any Amateurs with a handicap index, which when applied to a qualifying course rating, will generate a course handicap of two (2.0) or less. The PGA TOUR reserves the right to verify the handicap index of amateurs and to refuse anyone not meeting the requirements.

In accordance with the PGA TOUR Canada Tournament Regulations, a player must be 18 years of age or older to be eligible for membership. A player under the age of 18 may enter the PGA TOUR Canada Qualifying Tournament, provided the player turns 18 on or before the first scheduled round of the final (official money) PGA TOUR Canada tournament of the 2022 season. If a player under the age of 18 qualifies for the PGA TOUR Canada, the player would not become eligible for PGA TOUR Canada membership until his 18th birthday.

In accordance with PGA TOUR University Ranking List eligibility, all collegiate players will be ineligible for PGA TOUR University (in the current season and subsequent seasons) if they compete in a Qualifying Tournament for Korn Ferry Tour, PGA TOUR Latinoamérica or PGA TOUR Canada.

Exception: Players in the current season's Velocity Global Ranking may participate in the PGA TOUR Canada Qualifying Tournament.

Entry Fees

Entry fee of \$2,600 USD must accompany application and be payable by credit card. Use of a 'Visa Debit' card is not recommended. Entry fee includes green fee, range usage on the practice and competition days, as well as liability insurance coverage, covering liability which may arise as a result of the applicant's presence at a qualifying competition site.

Entry Availability, Deadline & Application Selection

The online application process will be available beginning Tuesday, January 4th at 12:00 PM (EST) for all member and non-member applicants. Only online entries will be accepted. Member applicants include 2021 FORME Tour members, 2021-2022 PGA TOUR Latinoamérica, & 2022 Korn Ferry Tour Members.

The entry deadline is Tuesday, January 11th at 5:00 PM (EST). After the entry deadline, PGA TOUR Canada will accept applications on a available basis. The entry fee for any player attempting to enter after the entry deadline will be \$3,000 USD.

Applications may be submitted for the one-week period as indicated by the entry availability and deadlines noted here.

Completed applications will be randomly selected until all tournament sites are filled in accordance with the Field Size & Site Assignment sections below. Any applicant whose applications are not selected pursuant to this process will not be eligible to compete in the 2022 PGA TOUR Canada Qualifying Tournament, and their entry fees will be refunded.

Note: Incomplete applications, or those not completed through the online application platform, will not be accepted. The entry fee must be paid in full in order for an application to be complete.

Notification of site assignments will be determined no later than Friday, January 14th and be accompanied by additional site-specific information.

Format

A 72-hole stroke play competition with the low 30 qualifiers and any player tied for 30th place earning eligibility status for the 2022 PGA TOUR Canada season. The winner of each site will be exempt for the entire 2022 season and not subject to any reshuffle(s).

Finishers 2-9 will be exempt through the reshuffle which will occur approximately halfway through the season. In the event of a tie for 1st or 9th position, there will be a hole-by-hole playoff immediately following play. Finishers 10-30 and any player tied for 30th place will receive conditional status to the PGA TOUR Canada for the 2022 season. See 'Performance Benefits' below for additional information on benefits to each membership eligibility status.

Field Size & Site Assignment

Maximum of 132 players per site. All 2021 members of the FORME Tour, as well as all 2021-2022 PGA TOUR Latinoamérica and 2022 Korn Ferry Tour Members will receive priority in site assignment but will be drawn on a random basis from within the same pool of member applicants. Member and non-member entries will not be assigned on a first-come, first-serve basis and both are subject to the same entry period. The PGA TOUR Canada reserves the right to balance the field size at qualifying sites by assigning any applicant, including members of the aforementioned tours whose applications are received prior to the entry deadline, to other sites as deemed necessary.

Should each of the sites/fields reach the maximum number of players, additional applicants will be assigned as an alternate to their highest-ranked (i.e., first) site preference. Similar to site assignments, alternates will be assigned on a random basis and PGA TOUR Canada reserves the right to balance the field size at qualifying sites by assigning any alternate to another site as deemed necessary, regardless of preference.

Alternates

An alternate list will only be applicable if all sites reach maximum field sizes.

Each site may, depending on the number of entries received, have its own alternate list. Once a site has exhausted its alternate list, the next highest-assigned alternate at the next qualifying site will be eligible for any available playing opportunity. The 'next qualifying site' is deemed to be either the next qualifying site to be played after the one in question, or the first qualifying site in the schedule if no qualifying tournaments have been contested at that time.

If and when a spot becomes available at any of the sites, it will be offered to the next alternate, either from that site or the next highest-assigned alternate at the next qualifying site. If an alternate chooses not to accept a spot, he will retain his spot on the alternates list and the next- available alternate will be contacted and so on, until the spot is filled. Any alternate withdrawing from a qualifying competition site alternate list will receive a full refund at the time of their withdrawal or once that qualifying site has been contested. If an alternate is not offered a spot (i.e., due to an insufficient number of withdrawals) they would also receive a full refund. **Note:** Alternates wishing to wait on-site at qualifying competition location may do so at their discretion. If, beginning during the official practice round/registration date (i.e., the date preceding the first round of official competition) through the last starting time of the first round of the competition, a player withdraws or does not show for his starting time, an on-site alternate will be eligible to compete. The procedure for using alternates in this manner will use the ranking for alternates as outlined below, but only apply to those on-site.

Site assignments, once distributed, are considered final.

Starting Times

Starting times will be available two days preceding the Qualifying competition at the qualifying site or online at www.pgatour.com/canada

Withdrawals & Refunds of Accepted Applicants

Applicants who are placed in qualifying competition fields may withdraw but will remain subject to the following processing fees. Should the applicant withdraw from their respective field prior to the dates listed below at 5:00 PM (EST), they will be assessed a processing fee of \$300 USD. Should the applicant withdraw from their respective field after the dates listed below, they will be assessed a processing fee of \$500 USD. No refunds will be issued to contestants after they have started play in the Qualifying Tournament. Contestants who withdraw during the round, or prior to the conclusion of the competition, may be subject to disciplinary action. Full refunds will be offered to those who withdraw while on the alternate list or those who aren't offered a playing opportunity.

Any applicant that withdraws for any reason will not be able to re-enter the qualifying tournament.

Practice Rounds

There will be one scheduled Practice Round day before each Qualifying Tournament (i.e., the first date listed in the 'Qualifying Competition Sites' section above). Additional practice round availability and the cost associated are at the discretion of the host facilities. Practice rounds on the official practice days will be awarded on a first-come, first-served basis (no tee/starting times will be accepted). To practice outside of the official practice day at your assigned site, please call the host venue and book a tee time, but only once you have been assigned to that site and site-specific information has been distributed.

Rules of Golf

Play shall be governed in accordance with the Rules of Golf of the United States Golf Association/Golf Canada as modified by the PGA TOUR Canada Local Rules and Terms of Competition card and supplemented by the Notice to Players at each qualifying competition site.

Distance-measuring devices are permitted for use during the Qualifying Competition. If during a qualifying competition round, a player uses a distance-measuring device to gauge or measure other conditions that might affect his play (e.g., elevation changes, wind speed, etc.) the player is in breach of Rule 4.3a. See Rule 4.3a of the Rules of Golf, effective January 2019, for more information.

Groove and Punch Mark Specifications, Model Local Rule G-2 is in effect, but is modified as the exception to G-2 does not apply.

Pace of Play will be in accordance with the PGA TOUR Canada Pace of Play Policy except that the fine structure will not apply.

Additional information and any questions pertaining to the Rules of Golf or the qualifying competition itself should be directed to the PGA TOUR Canada Rules Committee. In addition, questions, or disputes (including equipment rulings) shall be settled by the on-site Rules Committee appointed by the PGA TOUR Canada, whose decision shall be final.

Spike Policy

The use of traditional metal spikes is permitted during the Qualifying Competition. Soft spikes may be required during practice rounds at the discretion of the host facilities.

Transportation

Players and Caddies shall walk at all times during the Qualifying Competition (including the official practice round), except when permitted to ride by the Rules Committee. Players are not required to have a caddie; they may carry their clubs or use a manual or motorized pull cart.

Anyone seeking a golf cart due to a disability defined under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) or other applicable law should contact the PGA TOUR Competition Department at (904) 285-3700 to obtain information on procedures for submitting such requests. All such requests due to temporary injuries or impairments that do not qualify as a "disability" under the ADA or other applicable law will not be granted.

Appearance

Players: While on the host facility property, players shall present a neat appearance in both clothing and personal grooming. Blue jeans, cutoffs, T-shirts or shirts with no collar shall not be worn. Shorts are permitted only during the official practice round and the days prior; players will be required to wear long pants on official competition days (this also includes when using practice facilities on-site).

Caddies: While on the host facility property, caddies may wear either long pants or tailored solid colored knee length shorts or skirts. Blue jeans, cutoffs, T-shirts or shirts with no collar shall not be worn. Smooth rubber sole shoes are required. Sandals, open toe shoes, and golf shoes with traditional metal or soft spikes are prohibited.

Conduct

While on host facility property during qualifying rounds; players and caddies shall conduct themselves in a professional manner. PGA TOUR reserves the right to remove a player from the qualifying competition for; non-competitiveness; conduct unbecoming a professional by the player; conduct unbecoming a professional by the player's caddie.

Non-Competitive Performance

The PGA TOUR Canada reserves the right to remove an applicant from the competition if an applicant returns a non-competitive score after any round of the PGA TOUR Canada Qualifying Tournament. Non-competitive performance may also result in imposition of eligibility constraints from future qualifying competitions. Refunds will not be granted for any player removed from the competition for returning a non-competitive score.

Reduction or Cancellation

Any reduction or cancellation in the respective qualifying competition shall be in accordance with Reduction/Cancellation Guidelines as found in the PGA TOUR Tournament Regulations. In the event that the competition is canceled, all entry fees will be refunded.

If, in the judgment of the on-site PGA TOUR Canada Tournament Director or designee, whose decision shall be final, conditions render commencement or continuation of tournament play inadvisable, play shall be postponed until such time as the PGA TOUR Canada Tournament Director or designee determines that such weather conditions or other occurrences or conditions have improved sufficiently for play to commence or resume.

In situations involving adverse weather conditions or any other occurrence or condition, our first priority is the completion of the qualifying competition. Every effort will be made to achieve this objective by the end of the scheduled competition day. In the event the qualifying competition cannot be completed by the end of the scheduled competitive day, play will be extended. Every effort will be made to complete the qualifying competition as soon as possible. The competition (notwithstanding any playoffs) will not continue beyond the end of the day immediately following the last scheduled tournament round of the competition(s). The Bad Weather Policy and any weather-related information affecting the competition will be posted and communicated at each qualifying competition site.

The PGA TOUR reserves the right to change the format, venue(s), field size, qualifying spots, and other criteria as presently contemplated.

Travel

As stated above, the Reduction or Cancellation policies set forth in the PGA TOUR Tournament Regulations allows for an additional day of competition in order complete play. Historically, at least once per year, the final round and playoff have been completed on the fifth day. Please plan travel accordingly.

Membership

The winner upon the conclusion of play in each qualifying competition will earn exempt membership for the 2022 PGA TOUR Canada season. Finishers 2-9 will be exempt through the reshuffle which will occur approximately halfway through the season, unless the PGA TOUR Canada, in its sole discretion, elects not to award membership based on other factors. Conditional membership will be awarded to players that finished 10- 30th and ties at each Qualifying Tournament.

The deadline to submit an 'Application for Membership' and payment of \$475.00 USD for annual dues and liability insurance is May 21, 2022.

PGA TOUR Canada is anticipating 10 regular-season events to be included in the 2022 schedule, which is projected to be conducted beginning in late May and concluding in mid-September. Additional membership information, the ability to commit to events and more is available to successful qualifiers who take out membership upon payment of their dues. All information is provided online through the PGA TOUR LINKs membership portal.

Ties will be broken at each site for the purpose of ranking on the 2022 eligibility list by matching final round scores. Ties remaining after the match of final round scores will be broken by matching individual hole scores in descending order, beginning with the 18th hole of the final round.

NOTE: Conditional membership **does not** guarantee players starts in PGA TOUR Canada events.

NOTE: Players finishing in the lowest 30 players and players tied for 30th place who are amateurs, are under 18 years of age or who choose not to take out membership following the completion of the qualifying school are still included in the lowest 30 and ties for membership eligibility and ranking purposes.

Orientation

At the conclusion of each qualifying competition, players who are eligible for membership with the PGA TOUR Canada may attend an orientation session to be held immediately following the final scheduled competition round. Please plan your travel accordingly.

Annual Meeting

At the season-opening event an Annual Meeting will be held for the membership in the field that week. Per the PGA TOUR Canada Tournament Regulations, Annual Meeting(s) of the members of the PGA TOUR Canada shall be held annually, on a date and at a place to be determined by the Commissioner at least 60 days prior to the holding thereof. Players invited to attend shall include all regular members of the PGA TOUR Canada. All PGA TOUR Canada members in the field shall be required to attend. Failure to do so will result in a fine.

Performance Benefits

A player winning three times in the same season on the PGA TOUR Canada would receive immediate access to the Korn Ferry Tour in a category immediately following PGA TOUR Members Not Exempt for the Current Event. In the subsequent season, if a three-time winner is not also the leader on the PGA TOUR Canada Points List, he would be placed last in the category of leading Points List winners of the International Tours and following the winner of the Korn Ferry Tour Qualifying Tournament.

The top five players on the 2022 PGA TOUR Canada Points List will receive Korn Ferry Tour membership for 2023. The player who finishes 1st on the 2022 PGA TOUR Canada Points List will receive exempt status on the Korn Ferry Tour for the 2023 season. Finishers 2-5 will also be exempt into Final Stage of the 2022 Korn Ferry Tour Qualifying Tournament.

Players finishing in positions 6-10 on the 2022 PGA TOUR Canada Points List will be exempt into the Final Stage of the 2022 Korn Ferry Tour Qualifying Tournament.

Players finishing in positions 11-25 on the 2022 PGA TOUR Canada Points List will be exempt into the Second Stage of the 2022 Korn Ferry Tour Qualifying Tournament.

All 2022 PGA TOUR Canada members will be exempt into the First Stage of the 2022 Korn Ferry Tour Qualifying Tournament.

The top 60 players on the 2022 PGA TOUR Canada Points List will be fully exempt for the 2023 PGA TOUR Canada season.

Terms & Conditions

TELEVISION, RADIO, MOTION PICTURE, PHOTOGRAPHIC, ELECTRONIC, INTERNET AND SIMILAR RIGHTS/DECLARATIONS: The undersigned hereby grants and assigns to PGA TOUR, Inc., without limitation, the undersigned's individual television, radio, motion picture, photographic, electronic, internet "Interactive Applications" (as defined below) and all other media rights with respect to the undersigned's participation in the qualifying tournament or any portion thereof (i.e., at all times on-site during Tournament week and during any Tournament-related activities), or any other footage of the undersigned that may be captured by PGA TOUR Entertainment or its contractors with the undersigned's permission, with the understanding that PGA TOUR's use thereof shall be limited to the following: (1) advertising, promoting or publicizing the PGA TOUR CANADA, PGA TOUR, PGA TOUR charitable initiatives, tournaments or any broadcasts thereof; (2) live broadcasts during tournaments, (3) broadcasts or exhibitions on a recorded basis as part of a program or motion picture of tournaments or year-end summaries of sports award programs, any news or sports news or other programs or any other transmission, reproduction, recording, or photograph of tournaments in any and all media now known or hereafter developed; provided, that no rights are being granted hereunder by the undersigned for use in any program or motion picture designed for instructional purposes; and (4) live or taped non-exclusive updates. "Interactive Applications" shall mean the presentation in any medium in a way that permits the viewer to interact with or manipulate the presentation or access other relevant information during the presentation. The undersigned understands that use of social media during the Tournament is permitted to the extent provided in the PGA TOUR Trial Guidelines for Players Posting/Streaming to Social Media On Site and At Events, as may be amended by TOUR ("Social Media Guidelines") and agrees to comply with the Social Media Guidelines. The undersigned agrees to refrain from any action which will interfere with PGA TOUR's ownership of the rights hereunder granted and assigned to PGA TOUR or with any authorized use thereof. The undersigned also agrees to abide by and be governed by the PGA TOUR Tournament Regulations

currently in effect (and, if a member of PGA TOUR, attest that a copy thereof has been furnished to me) and by the Rules of Golf of the R & A, subject to any modifications thereof approved by PGA TOUR.

The undersigned hereby declares that they have the financial capacity to support themselves on the PGA TOUR CANADA for one full year and that the foregoing information furnished by player in the Application is true and complete; and understands that any materially false statements herein furnished by player may result in their expulsion from the Tournament and the suspension or termination of their playing privileges in tournaments cosponsored, approved or endorsed by PGA TOUR, Inc.

DRUG TESTING: I understand that drug testing may be conducted on players pursuant to the PGA TOUR Anti- Doping Program (“the Anti- Doping Program”). As a potential member of PGA TOUR CANADA, I understand I may be bound by the requirements of the Anti-Doping Program specifically including but not limited to the following: to provide a urine and/or blood sample to any testing agency authorized by the PGA TOUR at any time or place without advance notice; that refusal to provide the type of sample required by the PGA TOUR, if requested, will constitute an antidoping rule violation; that any sample collected shall become the property of the PGA TOUR; that the PGA TOUR may disseminate information pertaining to me relevant to the Anti-Doping Program, as permitted by the Anti-Doping Program; and that the Results Management provisions of the Program shall provide the sole and exclusive method for resolving any dispute related to drug testing.

INTEGRITY PROGRAM: The PGA TOUR Integrity Program is intended to maintain integrity and prevent betting-related corruption in PGA TOUR competitions. I consent and agree to be bound by all terms of the PGA TOUR Integrity Program Manual (the “Integrity Program Manual”) with respect to my participation in the Tournament. The Integrity Program Manual, among other things: things, prohibits me from betting on the Tournament and providing inside information to third parties for purposes of betting on the Tournament; requires me to report any violations of the Integrity Program Manual to the PGA TOUR; and establishes a process for the monitoring, investigation, sanctioning and disclosure of violations of the Integrity Program Manual.

By submission of this entry, I agree to the following:

- I agree to the regulations on ‘2022 PGATC Qualifying Tournament - Procedures & Information’ included herewith and I agree that my entry is subject to rejection at any time.
- I agree that certain risks are inherent to the game of golf and accept personal and sole liability for all such risks.
- I agree that the responsibility of ensuring this application is received by PGA TOUR CANADA by no later than the applicable entry deadline as set forth on ‘2022 PGATC Qualifying Tournament - Procedures & Information’ is mine alone and that this application will be automatically rejected if it is received by PGA TOUR CANADA after such date and time.
- I agree that the risk of delay lies solely with me and that the PGA TOUR CANADA has no liability with respect to any such delay and the consequences there from, including rejection of this entry.
- I agree that the application must be completely executed before I will be entered in the Tournament.
- I agree that all charges associated with this application made to either my personal credit card or a third-party credit card are my responsibility and that should these charges be rejected, disputed or otherwise remain unpaid, my membership privileges in PGA TOUR CANADA may be forfeited. Notwithstanding the foregoing, PGA TOUR CANADA reserves the right to deduct any rejected, disputed or otherwise unpaid charges from any prize money owed to me.

Personal information collected from applicants will be used by PGA TOUR for the purpose of administering the tournament and to provide applicants with information relating to products, services and promotions of PGA TOUR and affiliates of PGA TOUR. PGA TOUR shall not sell, share or otherwise disclose personal information of applicants with third parties, other than to third parties engaged by PGA TOUR to fulfill the above purposes or as otherwise consented to by the applicant.
